

Assigning a Literal Value to a Mapping Target

To assign a literal value to a property proceed as follows:

procurementAddress: ProcurementAddress

addressType: String

name: String

number: Integer

postcode: String

street: String

supervisor: ProcurementSuperior

costCenter: Integer

department: String

name: String

town: String

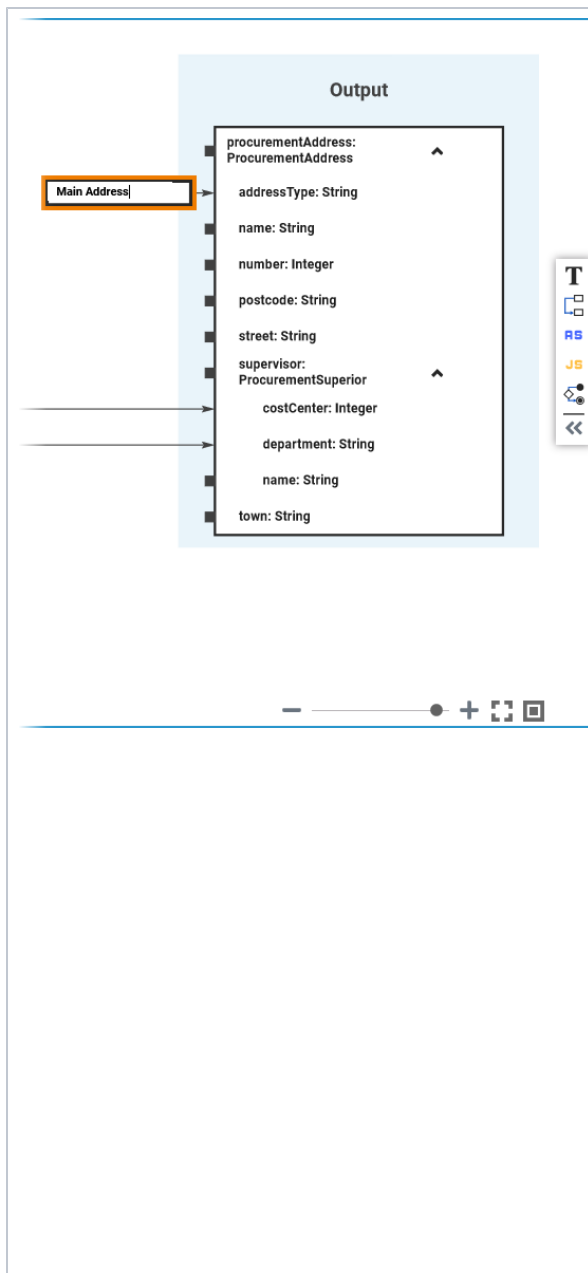

Click on **L** **iteral** in the elements toolbar, and select a property to assign a literal value to (or use drag & drop).


To cancel the procedure , press **Esc** .

A box appears where you can enter the literal value. Press **Enter** to save the value.

You can change the value by double-clicking the box and entering a new value. To delete the literal value, select the box and press the **Del** key, or select  from the context menu.

If the direction of the output item (**procurement Address**) changes from out to in, the literal is not of use anymore and is automatically deleted.
