Inactive Profiles

Users of Process Mining can create analyses for every process that is saved in one of their assigned profiles. Therefore, they will notice if a profile has been disabled: If a profile is deactivated, the user will not be able to analyse the corresponding processes any more.



Already created analyses will show the message **No permission to analyse this process.**
