

# Deleting Form Elements

Previously created form elements can also be deleted. Open the **context menu** to do so.

<div><div>Contact Data</div><div><div>First Name</div><div></div></div><div><div>Last Name</div><div></div></div><div><div>Phone</div><div></div></div><div><div>E-mail</div><div>Please enter a valid email address</div></div></div> <div><div>Options</div><div><div>Copy</div><div>Delete</div><div>Cross Reference</div></div></div>	<p>Open the context menu on a form element. One of the available options will be <b>Delete</b>.</p>
<div><div><div>!</div><div>You delete the element and its content.</div></div><div><div>Notice: Linked elements will not be deleted and are still available by using the search.</div></div><div><div>DELETE</div><div>CANCEL</div></div></div>	<p>Chosing this option triggers a confirmation prompt to pop up. Once you confirm the prompt using the <b>Delete</b> button, the element is erased from the database.</p> <p>If this element is linked to other forms, then only the current element is deleted. The links remain untouched.</p>

#### Deletion Behavior of Responsive Elements

If you delete a responsive element, it is erased from your work area including all content. While the responsive element will also be erased from your database, its content can still be found and used via the search function.

If the responsive element was linked prior to deleting, then only the current element is erased. The linked elements remain intact and can be found via the search function.
